

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The Nursing and Midwifery programs are designed to give varying entry points for Registered Nurse applicants with different qualifications and experience. Applicants for the graduate certificate or graduate diploma courses should normally have an approved tertiary qualification. Applicants for the masters programs should have a relevant honours degree or a graduate diploma.

ADVANCED STANDING (CREDIT TRANSFER)

You may apply for advanced standing towards your degree if you have relevant qualifications or work experience.

INVESTMENT

The Nursing and Midwifery courses are an investment in your career. Courses are offered on a fee-paying basis. In some cases tuition fees are tax deductible or eligible for employer-provided subsidy. Limited Commonwealth Supported Places may be available.

Australian citizens and some permanent residents enrolled in the programs can access an interest free loan to cover their tuition fees through FEE-HELP. Further details regarding FEE-HELP can be obtained by visiting www.goingtouni.gov.au.

COURSE DURATION

These courses are offered off campus with a significant on-campus component by part-time study. The graduate certificate courses are normally completed in two semesters of part-time study, while the graduate diploma courses are completed in two semesters of full-time study. The masters courses are normally completed in three semesters of full-time study or the part-time equivalent.

HOW TO APPLY

To apply for postgraduate study simply submit an online application by visiting www.deakin.edu.au/apply. Please ensure that you are aware of closing dates and further application requirements, follow all the application steps and provide all relevant information regarding previous study and work experience. For more information about how to apply and closing dates visit www.deakin.edu.au/postgrad.

You can begin your postgraduate course in semester 1 or semester 2. Semester 1 begins in late February and semester 2 in July. Some programs require you to complete an intensive block in February or July. Applications for semester 1 should be submitted to the University by mid October and applications for semester 2 by early April. Early applications are advisable.
