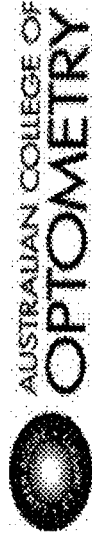
Your name will be added to our waiting list and an appointment will be posted to you after your eligibility to attend the clinic has been established.

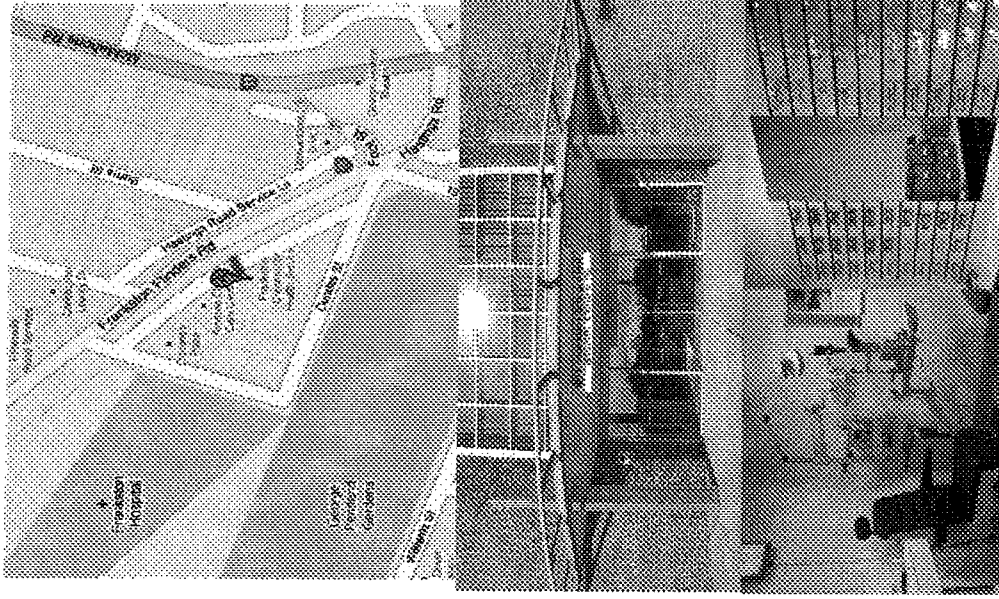

OPTOMETRY CLINIC

The Frankston Community Health Service Inc and the Australiasn College of Optometry provide eye examination and glasses at low cost to pensioners and other low incomes.

This Clinic forms part of the services provided by the Australian College of Optometry and is supported by the Victorian Department of Human Services.

Consultation fees are bulk billed to Medicare.

If glasses are clinically necessary for eligible patients, they can be provided at a subsidised cost.

ELIGIBILITY

People who are eligible to attend the Clinic include permanent residents of City of Frankston, Aspendale, Edithvale, Chelsea, Bonbeach, Pattersons Lakes, Carrum and Carrum Downs, Seaford, Langwarrin and Mornington Shire Council areas

- hold a Pensioner Concession Card in your own name, and dependants under 16 years of age
- have held a Health Care Card continuously for at least 6 months, and dependants
- are Wards of the State

PLEASE BRING

- Medicare card
- Pensioner Concession or Health Care Card
- GP details
- List of medications and eye drops
- Current glasses
- A referral letter from previous Optometrist/Ophthalmologist, if examined within the last 2 years.

SERVICES

The Optometry Clinic at the Frankston Community Health Service provides primary optometry care through its General Clinic. All aspects of visual function are investigated, such as eye health, binocular vision and your spectacle prescriptions.

Contact lens care and services can be provided.

Ocular Disease Clinics including Retina Clinic and Glaucoma Clinic are running periodically to manage the detection and monitoring of ocular diseases. The clinic can also provide therapeutic care or triage with local GP/ ophthalmologist as appropriate. You may be referred into these specialist clinics by your own eyecare practitioner or as a result of your eye examination in the General Clinic.
