Family Solutions Child FIRST Frankston Mornington Peninsula aims to improve service accessibility for families who face complex parenting issues, striving to provide a community based service to families and children in need. Early intervention by community services such as Family Solutions aims to assist families improve their parenting capacity and reduce the potential escalation of family difficulties. This may also minimise the likelihood of progression of families into the child protection system.
