About Us

PENINSULA HEALTH MAJOR SITE LOCATIONS

Peninsula Health is the major metropolitan health service for Frankston and the Mornington Peninsula.

We care for a population of 300,000. We provide a safe and inclusive workplace where our values are more than just words, they represent our work culture.



We provide care to local residents from birth through to end-of-life care, and a comprehensive range of sub-specialties including emergency medicine, intensive care, obstetrics and gynaecology, aged care, rehabilitation, oncology, mental health, and care in the home.

Our service consists of four major hospitals: Frankston Hospital, Rosebud Hospital, Golf Links Road Rehabilitation Centre and The Mornington Centre.

We also have five community mental health facilities and five community health centres in Frankston, Mornington, Rosebud, Hastings and Carrum.

We are a major teaching and a research hospital, with strong partnerships with universities, local government and community-based providers, to ensure we meet the needs of our patients.

OUR AIM

Our Graduate Nurse and Midwife Programs provide newly registered nurses, enrolled nurses and midwives with a safe and positive environment, supporting the development of skills and confidence to provide excellent patient care.

We recognise all graduates are not the same. We will work with our graduates to provide a program that considers individual needs.

We offer graduate programs in general nursing, mental health and midwifery in both straight and combined streams.

Acceptance into our graduate program provides graduates with a permanent, ongoing position at Peninsula Health. On completion of the **53 week program**, graduates will remain a valued member of the Peninsula Health team, with an opportunity to express interest in preferred ward or units.

GENERAL NURSING (RN)

Our structured program assists graduates to build on their strengths and support areas of further development. Our variety and flexibility of rotations provides a graduate program that meets individual needs.

- Choice of 2 x 6 month rotations or 3 x 4 month rotations
- Two days orientation
- Supernumerary shifts on all rotations
- Clinical support for each rotation
- Four study days, a mixture of online learning, workshops and simulation
- Regular in-services
- **LEAP program** — spend a supernumerary day in an area you would like to try out — more than 30 areas available
- Free internal courses and study days to expand specific knowledge and skills, for example IV cannulation, PICC, cardiac monitoring
- Requests can be made for rotation, with 24 areas to choose from
- Clinical support available Monday to Friday, with morning and afternoon shifts and weekends from educators or clinical support nurses

ENROLLED NURSING (EN)

Our structured 12 month Enrolled Nurse graduate program supports the newly registered EN to consolidate their knowledge and skills in both acute and subacute areas.

- 2 x 6 month rotations
- 2 days orientation
- Supernumerary shifts on all rotations
- Clinical support available Monday to Friday, with morning and afternoon shifts and weekends from educators or clinical support nurses
- 4 graduate specific study days with a mixture of online learning and F2F
- Regular in-service sessions
- **LEAP program** - spend a supernumerary day in area you would like to try out
- Free internal courses available to enable graduates to continue to expand their knowledge and skills

MENTAL HEALTH

Peninsula Health offers both a Mental Health Graduate Program and a Mixed Mental Health and General Nursing Graduate Program.

All Mental Health graduates complete 2 x 6 month rotations.

Mental Health only rotates to two different mental health area's whilst the Mental Health and General Nursing stream rotates between six months mental health and six months general.

General rotations include medical, surgical or emergency.

All mental health graduates complete the Graduate Diploma of Mental Health with one of our many affiliated universities.

- 2 x 6 month rotations
- One day orientation to Peninsula Health and three day orientation to Mental health on commencement
- 2-4 supernumerary shifts in all rotations
- Ten mental health nursing study days, with a mixture of face-to-face and online
- **Free internal courses** — expand your knowledge and skill
e.g. *IV cannulation*
- Support and mentoring
- Clinical Supervision
- Regular debrief sessions
- Support from the Early Career Development Team
- **LEAP Program** — spend a day in an area you would like to try out

MENTAL HEALTH ENROLLED NURSING

The Mental Health Enrolled Nursing Program provides newly registered enrolled nurses with the skills and knowledge required to care for mental health consumers.

- 2 x 6 month mental health rotations
- Four days orientation
- Supernumerary shifts on all rotations
- Study days
- Support and mentoring
- Clinical Supervision
- Regular debrief sessions
- Support from the Early Career Development Team
- Regular in-service sessions
- **LEAP program** - spend a supernumerary day in area you would like to try out
- Free internal courses available

MIDWIFERY

Graduate midwives work in a highly supportive environment, with the opportunity to apply theoretical knowledge and practical skills in a variety of areas of midwifery.

The Midwifery Graduate Program offers both a midwifery only and midwifery and general nursing program.

Both programs offer multiple midwifery rotations. The midwifery and general program includes a three month rotation to a general nursing area which may include medical, paediatrics, surgical or emergency.

- Comprehensive orientation
- Clinical rotations of varying length
- Minimum five paid midwifery study days
- **FSEP** and **PROMPT** professional development days
- Graduate nursing professional development days (optional)
- Regular debriefing sessions
- Free internal courses available
- Supernumerary days for each rotation
- Support and mentorship
- Midwifery educators and clinical support midwives

All graduates are asked for a list of preferences for clinical rotations. We will try to meet as many preferences as possible, to ensure the graduate program is tailored to your individual needs. We also offer LEAP days so you can spend a day supernumerary in a new ward to try it out or increase your knowledge.

Peninsula Health Graduate Program Application Process

HOW TO APPLY

All graduate nurse positions for Peninsula Health are advertised through [eRecruit peninsula.mercury.com.au](https://www.peninsula.mercury.com.au).

Post-Graduate Medical Council of Victoria (PMCV) applicants must apply both to PMCV and Peninsula Health.

If you would like to apply for more than one stream you will need to complete separate applications.



COVER LETTER – 1 PAGE

- **Postgraduate medical council of Victoria (PMCV)** number if applicable
- Graduate Program stream
- Describe why you would like to complete your graduate year at Peninsula Health
- State at least one of Peninsula Health's values and provide examples of how you will meet this value



RESUME/CV – 2 PAGES

- Information listed in reverse chronological order (most recent at top) including:
 - › Education qualifications
 - › Clinical placements
 - › Employment history and relevant voluntary work
- **Provide two clinical referees** – relevant to stream EN/RN/midwife clinical educator, facilitator or preceptor
- Referees must be from two different placements

- **Midwifery** – minimum one referee must be from a midwifery placement
- **Mental health** – one referee must be from a mental health placement
- Include name, organisation, role, date of placement, email address and phone number



CLINICAL REPORTS

- 2 copies of your most recent clinical reports.
 - › General – one report from an acute general placement.
 - › Mental health – preference for one MH placement.
 - › Midwifery – one report from a midwifery placement



ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPT

- Copy of most recent academic transcript, including grading key
- If units were credited from previous courses, please also include these transcripts ie. *Diploma of Nursing*



INTERVIEWS

Interviews are not performed for **PMCV** candidates. Enrolled Nurse and Registered Nurse graduates with no **PMCV** video will be interview via **MS teams**.



SELECTION

- Graduate RN, Mental health and midwifery programs follow the **PMCV** process for program allocation
- Graduate Enrolled Nurse applicants and Non-PMCV Registered Nurse candidates are selected on documents provided and interview.
- Successful applicants will be notified via phone
