Hastings and Rosebud Community Health offer a women's health service staffed by a female, fully qualified registered nurse/midwife, sexual and reproductive health nurse.

We understand that when it comes to your health, you may feel more comfortable discussing your needs with another woman.

The free clinic offered at Hastings and Rosebud Community Health provides a friendly and relaxed approach to the health needs of women of all ages.

Did you know?

Most women diagnosed with cervical cancer haven't had regular Pap tests.

Pap tests are essential even if you have had the cervical cancer vaccine.

If you are due for your Pap test, book it today.

What services are provided?

- Preventive health screening including pap smears and breast examination (mammography referral)
- Pregnancy testing referral and advice
- Unplanned pregnancy counselling and referral
- Contraceptive advice and education
- Education regarding safe sex practices
- Advice for sexual and reproductive health issues
- Menopausal health issues
- Fertility awareness education
- Continence awareness/advice

The Pap test or Pap smear is a screening test used to check for cell changes on the cervix.

These changes are often due to an infection caused by the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV).

A small sample of cells is collected from the cervix and sent to the laboratory for examination under a microscope. The nurse can give you your results in about 3-4 weeks. You will also be advised about additional screening tests as necessary.
